

## Study visits feedback

We successfully ran 6 visits all face to face September & October in 6 countries at a safe time in the covid context, which we can be proud of.

# Strategic and political levels



## Strategic visits

3 visits were completed by the coordinator and an IFS representative in 2021 to Lister (Netherlands), Wiener Hilfswerk (Autria) and Fundacion Esplai (Spain). We will discuss the feedback at our upcoming strategic seminar in March 2022.

## Policy Work

The Policy Recommendations work has met a few times and is planning the direction of our White paper which will be used with politicians, national institutions, the EU commission and the UN. This work will be complete by the end of 2023.

**Awareness raising events** Partners have already started highlighting the links between non formal adult education and social justice to their national stakeholders in Italy and Sweden.
